New FOST Is Underway

The parish of Saint Thomas the Apostle at Ivy Mills was founded in 1729 at Ivy Mills (1/2 mile west of St Thomas' present site). The Willcoxes, the founding Catholic family and their Quaker and Episcopalian neighbors lived out the promise of William Penn's vision of religious toleration in his colony and by example showed the way to all who settled in the American colonies, even in Philadelphia, where the idea struggled to become fully functional.

Saint Thomas' parish history is unique. Parishioners can and should know the story well and make it known to the wider community. The volunteers of New FOST have taken up the challenge to do so. Immediate goals are to maintain the parish's Historic District, to re-start the popular Tours/Tour Guide and Saint Thomas School Heritage programs, work on promoting weddings in the 1852 Chapel, and to keep the parish informed every step of the way.
